My dear Kamuzu,

You will have heard from Mr. Munanka that we may hold the next Pafmeca Meeting in Uganda. I hope the date we have suggested will be convenient to you and your colleagues.

A matter I wanted to mention and seek your views on before we meet, is one regarding a full time Secretary for Pafmeca. I think we all agree that we should have a full time Secretary. The problem is, largely, getting a suitable person who is not already doing essential work for one of the Pafmeca organisations. It has been suggested to me that we might ask Mbiyu Koinange to accept that office. I think the suggestion is a good one, but naturally I cannot approach Mbiyu before getting your views.

I would have waited and raised the matter at the Conference when we meet. But the appointment of a Secretary is becoming urgently necessary, and I would like a decision reached before we meet if possible. I am therefore sending a similar letter to all the Pafmeca organisations to seek their views.
