and to extirpate thorns & thistles, so that the roots of Faith may germinate.

6. Ye are the ^{over} ^{thirsting} treading at the grain the floor, nicely separating the grain from straw
The ignorant laity, who are pale & uncertain, have you for their mind of the laws.

7. Whether the laity sees displeasing to you, they doubtless will say, that it is not right
Whatever they see you ^{adimplere} engage in in your work, they think to be lawful & free from fault.

8. Since you have been constituted shepherds of sheep, Be not slothful, like dumb dogs
Let not shark barking fail you, The rapacious wolf envies the safety of the sheep.

9. The faithful flock is sustained by threefold food, the Lord's body, by which health is assured
By the fruit of Samaria, which must be despatched soon, lastly food of this world, lest
^{commodi. Samanis} ^{the flock} it be exposed (one periclitetur). ^(bad will for convenient) ^(lest it be pernicious)

10. Ye & it is your duty to preach to your flocks, ye ought therefore anxious concern be
the substance, persons, quality
fore hand, what, to whom, the substance, the place, the time, the reason, so that no
one may say that you are erring in your duty.

11. It belongs to ^{your} office of your dignity, to give ^{gratus} gifts of grace to those
serving them, Be assured, if you ever sell the ^{muneris officiosus} gifts of faith that you
will incur the reproof of Gehazi.

12. Administer ^{gratus} to the common people, the Eucharist, ^{Cafer} these gratus
Baptize these gratus, according to the Apostle, give freely to all, keeping that
which may be your own.

13. Let your religion be religious, your conscience clean, your life virtuous
^{conversatione}

Your habits regular, your deportment gracious, let no stain of crime pollute you.

14. Let no laughter deprive the ^{sincere} ^{meatus} of your mind, let a grave witness be held in your countenance; (Sicut in iustitia habitas sit testis.) i.e. always maintain a grave demeanour. Let nothing entice you with dishonorable cares, you to whom are entrusted the keys of the the kingdom of heaven.

15. Be ye reserved, lest talkativeness, the nurse of vanities, draw you into a fault (recte guiltibus, i.e. later later Name as crimine). See Ainsworth. here it would seem to mean impudence.

Let the word which you ^{deserve} ^{present} be brief, for in much talking there is sin.

16. Be ye benevolent, sober, prudent, just, kind simple minded, charitable, Hospitable, humble, teaching those submitted to you, considering the miserable, correcting the depraved.

17. Oh that ye may be able to bear the pastoral charge, & ~~lead~~ ^{lead} a spiritual life, so that when you put off the clothing of flesh The Lord may put upon you an eternal robe.
