Gentlemen:

Mr Isaac
 Selman, who was Treasurer of this, Monroe County,
 at the time the College bonds were negotiated
 has placed in our hands a claim against you
 for \$250.00. Mr C. does not claim that he himself
 sold the bonds, but his compensation as fixed
 by law would have been \$250.00. if he had put
 the bonds on the Market, but it was thought best
 by interested parties to place the matter of sale in
 the hands of the Bank, or of Mr Hill, and Mr C.
 consented to turn the matter over, on the express
 promise of the Hon R. W. Miers, & Dr J. D. Maxwell
 of your body that upon the bonds being sold he
 should receive the sum of \$250.00. the same as
 if he had made the sale himself. As you know
 the money has been realized long ago on the bonds
 & Mr C. is disposed to assert his rights to his legal
 compensation, but prefers to do so without resort
 to the Courts, and as his attorneys we present the matter
 to you in this shape and hope that a satisfactory
