

To the Hon. Board of Trustees. *Greek*
Of Indiana University. *1888*

Gentlemen:

Forty-two students have been enrolled in the classes of the Greek Department this year. They were classified as follows: Graduate work, 1, (excused from residence at the Univ.); Seniors, 5; Juniors, 5; Sophomores, 6; Freshmen, 18; Greek in English, 7. The latter class extended through the first term only, the others throughout the year.

At commencement five students will receive the degree of A. B. and one the degree of A. M. in this department.

The beginning class has been the

largest since I have had charge of the department.

During the second term Prof. Gunn had charge of the Sophomore class. His work gave excellent satisfaction both to the class and to me, and I sincerely hope that he may be retained as associate in the Greek department.

This last term, by combining the Seniors and Juniors into one class, I have been able to teach all the Greek classes myself.

X Of the \$25.00 allowed the department at the autumn meeting of the Board, about $\frac{2}{3}$ has been used to secure a map of Greece and a chart of the Aegean, and to frame some pictures for

the recitation room. I should like to get another map next autumn with the remains of the same, if I have not forfeited it by not using it sooner.
