

To the Honorable Board of Trustees

Gentlemen:

In accordance with the permission granted me at your November meeting I have made arrangements to be absent from the University during the spring term and to spend the spring and summer in Europe. I shall sail from New York on the 19th of March and reach Athens about the 6th of April. Making my headquarters with the American School of Classical Studies at Athens, I shall spend April, May and June in Greece. I shall probably spend July and the first week of August in Sicily and Italy. I expect, of course, to return in time for the opening of college next September.
