The following is a report of the Classes I
am hearing as Assoc. Prof. Latin & Greek,
in the University:

1. Two sections of the Freshman Class in
Latin - the first hour class numbering 25, the
second hour, 15 - Cicero's Orationes and
Sallust's "De Catilinae Conjurazione" with
prose composition twice a week.
2. The Freshman Greek - class numbering 12 - in
Goodwin's Grammar & Lighton's Lessons.
3. A class for the fourth hour in Latin
Grammar with 25 pupils.

I could use a wall map or two to good
advantage in my recitations, as well as
pictures showing plan of the City of Rome,
the Coliseum, Forum &c. - my room being
at present destitute of all such things.

An allowance of a few dollars by the Board
could be, I think, profitably expended in
this way and I beg leave to make a request
for the same.
