To the President, for the Honorable Board of
Trustees of the Indiana University:—

It is probably not necessary, at this
time to make an extended report for the Department
of Physics. The work has simply outgrown our present
quarters. As many students, as could be accommodated, have
been working in the laboratory this term, while several were
asked to wait until next year for the work. It is hoped
that there will be additional room for our work as soon
as the new Library building is ready for occupancy,
and Departments that are to have rooms there are moved.

I would call attention to the fact that
the salary offered Mr. Foley, as Assistant in Physics,
was not such as he thought would justify him, under
his present circumstances, in accepting the position. He will
agree to stay, however, for 400 and I would respectfully
ask that the salary be increased to that amount, if possible.
I have already written a full statement of the case to the
