To the Honorable the Board of Trustees,
Indiana University;
Gentlemen,

At the meeting of the Faculty held Oct. 27, 1890, it was, after discussion, unanimously

Voted, that the Board of Trustees be requested to arrange to have the Library open for the Consultation of books all day on Saturdays as on other days of the week, and to have all College working rooms, including the Library, comfortably warmed on Saturdays in order that Professors and students may carry on laboratory work as continuously as may be desired.

Permit me to add that that this increase of library and laboratory facilities is regarded as essential to the success of the work in a number of departments.
