Gentlemen,

When leave of absence was granted me the condition was attached that I was bound to return to the Associate Professorship at a salary of \$1000.

I do not feel that I can in justice bind myself to return to a subordinate position. I can very probably, after one or possibly two years study at Harvard find elsewhere a position which will give me greater freedom ^{of opportunity} to do the work which I am best fitted to do.

I therefore feel that it is due to my own best interests to resign and go away entirely free.
