Dr Coulter:

Yours of yesterday received. I would ^{not} like to lure Prof. Woodburn, but I cannot tell what the Trustees would be willing to do in regard to his salary. I have been for years urging higher salaries, we have a number of men who ought to go to \$2000. and Woodburn is one. Personally I am in favor of giving it him, but I have no authority to pledge the other Trustees. I think they would not let him go on account of salary.

I think the time has come when we must pay better salaries, we cannot hold our men unless we do. I shall urge a general revision at our June meeting.
