The work as now arranged is as follows:-

Aley .- Analytic Mechanics, Conics, and Euclid.

Davisson. - Calculus, Synthetic Geometry, and Euclid.

Rothrock .- Higher Algebra, two classes in Euclid.

Wood. - One class in Euclid.

The department is crowded with students. The classes in higher mathematics are much larger than ever before. At present there are four students doing post graduate work. It gives me pleasure to say that the work of Mr. Messrs. Davisson, Rothrock and Wood is entirely satisfactory. They are good teachers, and have the entire confidence and cooperation of their pupils.

The books most needed in mathematics at present are those out of print.

The se can only be gotten through second hand dealers. Many times when we attempt to get such books through the usual library orders, we fail because the books are sold before our order is received. We therefore pray that the sum of \$200 cm be appropriated to the Department to be used at the discretion of the Professors in charge, in the purchase of such books for the library.
