- 1. Unanimous acceptance of recommendation from 6 October 1964  
Subcommittee of the Science Advisory Committee  
not to establish a separate School of Applied  
Science. Fac. Doc. No. 3
- 2. Unanimous acceptance of report from Committee 20 October 1964  
on the Improvement of Teaching. Fac. Doc.  
No. 2
- 3. Unanimous acceptance of recommendations of 20 October 1964  
Committee on Improvement of Teaching for  
greater uniformity and equivalency in treat-  
ment of graduate students associated with

a. Taken by consent that consideration 15 December 1964  
might be given to voting privileges  
for lecturers in any comprehensive sur-  
vey of academic personnel and practices.



- b. Recommendation that full-time teaching lecturers should continue to receive Faculty Council minutes taken by consent. 15 December 1964
  - c. Motion that no changes be made in present tenure policy as it applies to lecturers passed unanimously. 15 December 1964
  - d. Motion that lecturers with less than two years' service be given notice of termination of appointment 1 March of the expiration year, and lecturers with over two years' service be notified by 15 December of the terminal year passed unanimously. Effective academic year 1965-66. 15 December 1964
  - e. Referred to Retirement and Insurance Committee recommendation that full-time lecturers be admitted to TIAA. 15 December 1964
  - f. Motion to extend "all-campus" parking permits to full-time lecturers unanimously passed. 15 December 1964
  - g. Accepted by consent recommendation to include title of lecturer in faculty designation on Library home-use card. 5 January 1965
  - h. Voted, with two dissensions, to accept recommendation that expenses of travel to professional meetings by full-time lecturers be reimbursed by the University, such recommendation to be passed on to deans and heads of academic divisions. 5 January 1965
- University policy does not deny this allowance, but it is at the option of the individual college, school, or division. 20 April 1965
- 9. Voted, with one dissension, to request appropriate administrative officers to examine the question of the original title of appointment, i.e., use of "acting" faculty title. 5 January 1965
- General recommendation that title of lecturer be left available to the maximum amount of flexibility and that it be pointed out again to deans that the title of instructor is available. There is no University policy prohibiting its use for those without the terminal degree. 20 April 1965



10. Voted unanimously that a committee be appointed to consider amendment to the Faculty Constitution which would take into account the new academic administrative offices created (Vice-President for Research and Dean of Advanced Studies, Dean of the School of Nursing, and Provost of the Medical Center) and to consider also the possibility of increasing the number of elected members to the Council. 16 February 1965
  
11. Approved unanimously names for honorary degrees proposed by Committee on Honorary Degrees. 2 and 16 March 1965
  
12. Motion to recommend to the Board of Trustees that I.U. elect to continue ROTC on an elective basis in both two- and four-year programs passed unanimously. Fac. Doc. No. 17 2 March 1965
  
13. Motion unanimously passed to accept report of the Committee on Equality of Higher Educational Opportunity, and that such acceptance constitute endorsement of the broad aims of the Committee's statement, and, further, that no action be taken which contravenes the present admission requirements of the University for degree programs. Fac. Doc. 14, 14a 2 March 1965
  
14. Passed by a vote of 12 to 11 a motion that the Council recommend to the Calendar Committee that it consider the feasibility of eliminating Saturday morning classes prior to vacation. Fac. Doc. 16 16 March 1965
  
15. Unanimous acceptance of recommendations of Committee to Study Amendments to Faculty Constitution to include three new ex officio members, increase the faculty representation from 20 to 25 (three more from Bloomington, one each from the Indianapolis faculties and regional campuses), and to raise the qualifying number of voting members of an independent faculty unit from 8 to 30. Fac. Doc. No. 20 6 April 1965
  
16. Ad Hoc Committee on Academic Freedom instructed to reconsider draft of the report presented in light of the Council's comments and discussion and to report back to the Council. Fac. Doc. No. 21 20 April 1965



17. Visit of State Department Team on Viet Nam:
  - a. Defeated a motion by vote of 3 to 26 to ask Dean Heffner to call the State Department to learn if it would allow a speaker of stature with differing views to appear with its group. 4 May 1965
  - b. Defeated by a vote of 10 to 18 a motion that the University make every effort to bring this month a speaker of stature to present differing views in event the intent of the above motion was not effected. 4 May 1965
18. Accepted unanimously a proposal to change for undergraduates the period for an automatic "W" from four weeks to three (two in summer session) and to allow the addition of a new course after two weeks (one in summer session) only on petition of the instructor of the course to be added and approval of the student's dean. Fac. Doc. No. 19 18 May 1965
19. Accepted unanimously the name of a candidate proposed by the Honorary Degrees Committee to receive an honorary degree in connection with the state's sesquicentennial observance. 18 May 1965
20. Voted unanimously to accept the recommendation of the Calendar Committee to adopt a calendar based on a 60-minute period for 1966-67. Fac. Doc. No. 24 1 June 1965
21. Voted unanimously to approve in principle the payment of parking fees by University personnel and others who use University facilities. 1 June 1965
