

The committee heretofore appointed to superintend the
finishing of the new College building respectfully
Report: That since the last meeting of the
Board of trustees they have contracted with John
Graham & Samuel Hurdley Carpenters to furnish
materials and finish the whole wood work of said
building from the second floor upward, including
windows, floors, partitions, doors locks, &c. &c as they now
stand, for the sum of \$886.75-cents.

Of this sum there has been paid to said
workmen

1 st of money drawn from the Loan Office	\$200.00
2 ^d of money derived from sale of half $\frac{3}{4}$ section of land south of the College $\frac{3}{4}$	627.60
leaving unpaid	\$59.15.

The committee have also contracted with Charles
Hudson to furnish materials and build the fence
around the College square as it now stands
at the rate of 45 cents per perches amounting
to \$110.00. ————— 110.00

Also to Ellis Stone for making feeding
hinges chains &c and hanging six goats
the sum of. 48.00
\$158.00

Of the above sum \$75.00 were drawn
from the Loan Office and \$83.00 the
balance from the fund arising from
the sale of the half section of land
south of the college buildings.
