

Washington March 10th 1824

Dear Sir

I have just recd. yours of the 7th ult. containing [\$ 221] two hundred & twenty one dollars; one hundred of which, according to your direction, I have loaned to W. M. Ferrin, seven dollars & sixty nine cents [7.69] I have set to your credit in acct with me: the remainder, one hundred & thirteen dollars thirty one cents [113.31] is in my hands, for which I will pay you interest from the 1st of April next; as, at that time, I will be able to put it to a use where it will save me the payment of interest to another. I sent you the state of your acc. before. Now it stands as follows.

acknowledging the receipt of the money. At
any rate it may stand as it is till you return;
when, perhaps, we shall be able to come to some
certain conclusion respecting it. It would be well
for you to preserve any memoranda, or letter
from me which may be of use on the subject.

For the grammars, it is not my design to
charge you, only on condition that you can
sell them. Mr Gates has some which are
dead lumber on his hands. I would thank you
when you return, if convenient, to bring them
with you, if they cannot be disposed of
sooner. — Dr Holey's nation I rec^d. & gave

immediately after hastily perusing it, to
Mr Innings. He has misplaced it somehow
so that it cannot now be had. He hopes to
across it some time. If I had it, however, I
could not review it now, as I have lately
received an order from the Board of Missions
to preach a missionary sermon before the
General Assembly in Philadelphia.

Preparations of one sort or other to fulfil my
appointment, will occupy all my spare time
till the 1st of May when I expect to start for the
city. After my return I may, perhaps, look at
the labored production, of the Dandy Doctor of
Socialism. Give my respects to all who may
enquire for me, especially to Judge Mills my
quondam preceptor - & accept them for you
self
