

Bloomington March 3^d 1841 43

Dr Sir

Your favor of the 26th ult
is received. I wrote you a letter on the
subject which had not reached you
I suppose, as your containing no reference
to it. My object is now simply to state
to the Bishop through you as hereby
I do. That after much serious deliber-
ation I think it my duty to seek
admission into the communion of
the Episcopal Church. I must ask
you the favor to write with some
Presbyter near you in giving me
the requisite testimony to the Bishop.
This, I believe, is all your Canons re-
quire in the first step. The clergy-
man in Jeffersonville or Louisville
I hope will feel free to write with
you in the required testimony in my
