

to be disrespectful or inflammatory in the remarks made in "The Student" (although he admitted when they were pointed out that they were liable to be misunderstood) & also disclaimed all other improper intentions, he therefore be admonished by the President, and a statement be made in chapel that although free discussion is permitted in "The Student", yet such discussion should always be in terms respectful to Trustees & Faculty, otherwise discipline would have to be applied on the part of the Faculty.
On motion adjourned.

Faculty met, all present except Prof. Mallows, sick; prayer by Prof. Kirkwood. W. G. P. Campbell allowed to become irregular after usual business, subject of examination taken up. A petition having been presented to commence examinations a few days sooner & let students leave, because a case of typhoid existed near college, Faculty decided to begin Wed. afternoon next & continue until completed, having six examinations of 2 hours each during each forenoon, & 3 each afternoon. Prof. Thompson & Kirkwood exchange, Prof. W. to be with Chem. Phy. Geogr. & Calculus; Prof. Kirkwood with Des. Geo. Prof. Ballou in Moral Science & German, Prof. Atwater present at Greek & to examine in Cicero. Prof. Bowen takes Prof. Mallows classes & Latin. Prof. Owen present at Accounts & Optics & French.
