May 8th 1873 Faculty met at 2½ P. M. Dr. Hull still absent at the Called Meeting of the State Board of Education. Cal. Thompson absent in Town School work. Dr. Owen still absent. (Min. app.) Mr. J. L. Taylor was reported as having been disobedient in class room, and being in waiting he was called. Having acknowledged the charge, and having offered an unsatisfactory excuse the following resolution was unanimously adopted,

Mr. J. L. Taylor having refused obedience to the requirement of his prof. in the preparation of an exercise, and also when directed to leave the room, Resolved that he be suspended from College for three days (Friday, Sat., and Sunday) not being permitted to enter the College building during the time, and as a condition of his return that he present Monday morning the exercise as prescribed, also that this Resolution be read in Chapel. While the resolution was pending Dr. Owen entered Faculty Room & in the midst of many greetings reported Mrs. Owen's health somewhat improved. Some members of the faculty being absent further work on the Catalogue was deferred and Fac. adjourned.
