 to fix his standing. Pres. requested to see Mr. L. Rogers
 and represent to him the advantages of going to the
 High School Prep. instead of continuing in
 College. Messrs Gray and Barker applying for select
 studies were called in and stated their request.
 Mr. Barker assigned to Prep. Dept. Mr. Gray to remain
 (according to former decision) in Fresh. Class.
 Prof. Valentine to see H. C. Montgomery and say he
 can take Soph. studies. If he chooses to be absent this
 year expecting to return for the Soph. year he can
 do so with our good will. Consent to Prof. Valentines
 having a class in Greek the 4th hour the numbers
 not being fully occupied. Determined that there shall
