 day was presented. On motion the request was
 granted with the understanding that the time of

 of the Prof. of Eng. Litrat. Faculty discussed
 the disorder last Saturday eve at the Spelling match
 and elsewhere. President reported his attendance
 at the meeting of College Presidents at Chicago
 last week.
