"2. Admission of such suspended student to any other department of the University while such suspension is in force shall be wholly in the discretion of the Head of that department.

"3. Cases of misconduct seeming to require severer punishment than is provided for above, and cases of doubt and difficulty shall be referred at once by the instructor to a committee of three chosen by him from the Faculty to investigate the case immediately and recommend to the Faculty suitable action.

"4. A three-fifths vote of all the members of the Faculty shall be necessary to the imposition of a penalty by the Faculty in such cases."

Faculty met in Dr. Branner's room.

Univ. of Mich. A communication was read from the University of Michigan asking that a delegate be sent to represent this University at the 50th Anniversary on June 29, 30, 1887. Prof. Boone was chosen as delegate.

A petition was received from members of the senior class asking that the usual senior vacation commence Friday, May 21; which request was granted. Also a petition from seventeen members of the class asking that they be excused from speaking or reading on commencement day. It was decided that every graduate shall perform upon commencement day unless excused by

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the Faculty upon the recommendation of the professor under whom the graduating thesis is written.

On motion it was voted that Mr. Bicknell be allowed to graduate provided he present a fair equivalent for back work, acceptable to the professor concerned.

3/4 vote to convict.

It was decided that hereafter, in order to convict a student of a misdemeanor, three-fourths of the members present shall be required, provided the number voting to convict be a majority of the Faculty.

On motion the Board of Trustees was requested to furnish the Faculty with a statement of the Faculty's legal status and powers as regards college discipline.
