On behalf of the Committee appointed Oct. 26 to rearrange the work in Eng. Comp. & Rhet., Prof. Miter recommended that instead of the present requirement of 1 hour per week throughout 4 years, there be substituted 3 hours per week throughout 1 year, Freshman or Sophomore if practicable; that this be the requirement for the present Freshmen, that 3 hours per week through 6 terms be required of the present Sophomores, and that the work be optional for Juniors and Seniors after the present term; and this requirement be in addition to the 36 terms work now necessary to graduation.
