Meeting of Sept 14, 1921.

A meeting of the faculty was held Wednesday Sept 14 at 7:30 p.m. in Science 32, with President Bryan in the chair.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. <sup>Miss Stone</sup>

Dean Eigenmann moved that William <sup>in education</sup> be recommended for the A.M. degree <sup>as</sup> of 1921. Motion passed.

Dean Edmondson presented a report of the Committee on Student Affairs, and moved its adoption. The motion was carried.

Professor Woodburn, in behalf of the Committee on Convocations, recommended that a special Freshman Convocation lasting two periods be held on Sept 21. Motion passed.

Dean Stout moved that a faculty meeting be held Oct 5. Motion passed.

President Bryan extended to the faculty an invitation to an informal reception by himself and Mrs Bryan on Friday Sept 17 at 4:00 in the Trophy Room.

The meeting was declared informal.
