I hereby promise to tender my resignation so as to withdraw entirely from the Athenian Society, the resignation to take effect immediately; and to avoid in my intercourse anything which could be construed as instigating students to a disobedience of the Ordinances of the Board, & from all ungentlemanly treatment of those who have submitted; or I will immediately call a meeting of the Athenian Society & advise them to rescind their action & give an opportunity for such as desire to resign & for others to go on under the ordinances of the Board of Trustees.
