Roll called.

Minutes read and approved.

Mr. Mayfield reported that the barber shop had been moved to the main floor of the Student Building. Practically all the work has been completed and the barber shop is now doing business. Mr. Croucher wishes to have a telephone installed in the new barber shop. There will be no charge for rental of this phone as Mr. Croucher agrees to pay for this expense. Mr. Dwyer suggested that Mr. Mayfield take care of all the small details that are yet unfinished.

Mr. Moore stated that they were not able to secure any special entertainment for the coming Open Union Meeting. He said he was in favor of postponing this meeting until a later date when it would be possible to secure some special entertainment.

Mr. Lieber moved that the coming Open Meeting be postponed until the date of the next open meeting when the Board expect to put on an excellent smoker. Passed.

Mr. Huncilman reported that tonight is the night for the selection of the book for the Jordan River Revue. Mr. Huncilman interviewed Mr. Hays and he seemed to think that there would be room for a play put on by the Union.

Mr. Moore moved that the Board replace Mr. Swains position, owing to the fact that he was dropped because of the constitutional ruling on absences. Passed. The Union will receive nominations for this vacancy at its next meeting.

The question of the University using the Union drops (Gray curtains) came before the Board. It was decided that Mr. Lieber see the University and

make arrangements with them for the care of the Union's curtains. The Board feels that the University should take care of these curtains when they are used for University productions.

Mr. Lieber brought up the problem of the University taking measures to stop the stealing of wraps in the halls of the buildings. The Board is of the opinion that an open meeting be held and an attempt made to get to the bottom of this situation.
