Moore, Ringer, + Huncilman were appointed to look after the Smoker which the Union is to give for the Freshman Athletic Association.

It was decided that the Union should not donate to the Student Friendship Fund for students at Oleson University.

It was urged that Board members

boost the Union dance for Dec. 12 at which an imported colored orchestra is to play.

Pres. Fillion gave an interesting report of the Fifth Annual Conference of The Association of College & University Unions, held at the Houston Club, University of Penn. Nov. 28th & 29th, 1924, at which he was a delegate.

Mr. Lieber moved that an excuse be presented to the Board by members missing Board meetings. Excuses to be presented at the meeting following the absence, and passed upon by the Board. Passed.

The Board consented that the Union piano be tuned when necessary, in addition to the two yearly tunings furnished by Hagleton.
