Meeting called to order.

Roll Call.

Minutes read & accepted.

Mr. Alexander spoke to the Board in regard to the Memorial Fund & the plan for a Union Bldg. Of the original goal of \$1,600,000, \$1,450,000 has been secured. Two of three bldgs. planned have been constructed. The final plan was to build a Union Bldg. costing one million dollars, to include an auditorium in the Bldg.

Mr. Alexander said the time is here for student body to know what the Union Bldg. will be used for; and that a plan is under foot to finish securing the fund necessary to complete the Bldg; and that the Union Board is the body which will be expected to take most active part in a campaign.

Mr. Alexander said a movement should be put on foot to include every man in the Union and all alumni interested, who would purchase a life membership. The Committee appointed to investigate unions, etc, favored granting all who have contributed \$100.00 to Memorial Fund be given life membership in the Union.

The Memorial Fund organization would like to have the Board lay the ground-work for a greater Union when a Bldg. is secured.

Pres. Hencillman stressed the need of a

union Bldg. on the campus. He said it rested primarily with the body whether the dream of a Bldg was realized to its fullest extent.

Mr. Highway spoke of the importance of completing the drive. He stressed that it is up to the older students who have previously contributed to see the rest of the Student body on the project.

Mr. Hancilman said that we must be sold on the proposition for the drive has lost its momentum, and will be rather hard to be started again.

Question of barbershop. Mr. Sam Richardson reports that there is only one man in the Barber Shop, and that he has been losing money every week. Prof. Cogswell said that the failure of the shop in the last few years has led him to believe that the wisest step would be to close it.

Mr. Eberhart moved the Richardson be released from his contract after Feb 13, 1926. Passed. Prof. Treanor moved that the Shop be closed at the expiration of Richardson's lease. By assent agreed to leave problem of disposing of equipment up to Barber Shop Committee.

Mr. Nelson reports picture of union for last year is being prepared.

Mr. Eberhart reports Athletic Dept. will work with union in putting on stunt between games. Union sold ing to Tombraugh for \$500.

Tombaugh reports on dances—

Myers as Treas. of the Union. Homer Eberhart was elected to fill the vacancy.
