A membership campaign for next year was discussed. The president appointed Benzel, Cochran, Elliott, Tuttle and Reiter on a membership committee. The board voted to adopt the buttons as the official badge, at the same time cutting the price to 25¢.

Mr. Claywell suggested that the Union subscribe to a fund for good-will advertising in behalf of Memorial Fund, which is to be used to build a new Union building. It was suggested that the Union cooperate with the Olympiad in such a work. The board then voted to adjourn till next year.
