

Sept 28, 1926

At Roll Call Clark was absent with James Elliott excused.

Minutes of last meeting were read ^{and} corrected. Prof. Cagshall reported that Prof. Willis would ~~not be able to serve on the Union Board~~. The Board ~~then~~ selected Prof. Robinson to fill the position left vacant by Prof. Creanor.

Mr. Little reported that during the last week ^{there was} a net gain of \$124.05 in the treasury, of which \$8.25 came from the pool room, \$87.30 from the dance ^{receptant} ~~receptant~~ and \$5.00 ^{and \$5.00} respectively from the concession and check room, and \$5.00 from new memberships.

The Board voted to contract with the officials in the Masonic Temple for the Union dance dates with the provision that every sixth dance be free, the others to cost the Union \$30.00. It was moved to hire Carmichael's band for the dance.

The President appointed a social committee composed of James Cochran, chairman, and Frank Stinson and James Miller, and a pool room committee composed of Charles Benzel, chairman, Willard VanHorne and George White.

Following a general discussion on purchase of new pool tables, the Board voted to buy a Monroe Style Billiard and a Monroe Style Pool table at the price of \$744.23 and cues at 11th extra. Total 755.23.

Mr. Rector reported that the open meeting for the eve of the DePaw game would start at 6:45 with Mr. Cooper as chairman. President Bryan and Coach Page

were scheduled to make short talks. The band was to play but there was to be no organized cheering. The program was discussed and several suggestions made to the committee.

Mr. Ringer asked the support of the Board members in the drive for money for the band, after which adjournment took place.
