Roll Call. Bunker, Ramsey, Ray, Wall absent.
Minutes Dec 6 read & approved.

Clark reports having fair success in making collections from fraternities on Golden rule week. About \$40 collected.
Redding reports for chair committee. Chair at Wyler furniture Co, by Jasper Chair Co, seems best bargain. The committee is investigating for a heavier chair, at a price lower than \$16, piece of heavy chair from Croker Chair Company. By consent of Board, action on chair proposition delayed till later date.

Jones reports having received bids on cost of refinishing Assembly Hall floor. The bid being \$108. Charles Bays expressed his opinion to Jones that the University would probably pay the cost of refinishing the floor, this to be decided when Jones meets with University at Executive Committee. Jones was authorized to proceed with negotiations, and try to have work done during X mas vacation. He was also authorized to investigate cost of decorating the Hall for the dance of Jan 6.

No report on negro refund situation, or from telephone committee.

Ruiger announced that Pres. Bryan had requested the Union to consider using the University Union Fee Fund as a means for defraying expenses of Mr. Basil Clark, as delegate to Convention of ~~the~~ Student Councils at Lincoln Mo. After discussion a motion was made that in view of the fact that other means for financing this expenditure were lacking, the Union permit the use of its fund as a means of defraying the cost of sending the delegate.
Motion carried.

Ruign reported that the Acons and the Men's Panhellenic Council were considering awarding sweaters to yell leaders. As neither of those organizations have strong financial basis, the matter was referred to the Union. Objection was raised to awarding sweaters for purposes other than pure athletic awards. A Committee of Ridding, Richardson, Fokner was appointed to consider the proposition, and formulate any plans in that connection, and submit them to the Union Board.

Ruign reported on proceedings at the Convention of University Unions at Iowa City. This report filed with President's records. He reported expense of 74.60, which met with O.K. of Board.

Bill of \$1.00, taxi fare for dance Nov 5 presented by Clark. Bill allowed, ^{University-Columbia}

Bill for pool room expenditures through Potter for 22.12. Potter reported that \$15.00 of that amount was valid, but remainder was due to error of comparing. B. Treasurer was authorized to make out check for \$15.00.

\$0.25 for stamps, paid, University Book Store Allowed
