

May 8, 1928

Roll call. Minutes of May 3 read & approved as corrected.

Pres. Deitsch reported on the bill from the I. U. Press. \$369 of the amount charged to the Union is owed by the Hoosier Journal of business. This leaves a balance charged to the Union of \$184.99 of which \$137 is labeled "Old Balance". Three items of \$11, \$4, + \$20.75 were requisitioned from the Union Fee Fund but not pd. Another charge of \$12 in 1927 was not pd. Further investigation will be made & an itemized statement will be obtained of the old balance of 1926.

Treas. was instructed to investigate the bills from Ind. Daily Student. Following bills were reported:

\$1.00 Dixie Taxi Co. for taking chaperones from dance Apr 21 - allowed
\$0.85 Varsity Pharmacy for cards for dance of April 21 - "

The advisability of the Union publishing an information booklet & directory for all men students again discussed & Ramsey reported cost of the A. M. S. pamphlet was approx. \$150 for 500 copies. Estimated cost of 2,000 such pamphlets for Union was \$250. However, in view of the fact that the Y. M. C. A. expressed its intention of including more information in the Red Book & of publishing it much earlier next fall, a motion was made that the Union defer action on the booklet for another yr. Motion carried.

Melrose Music Co. offer again discussed & Miles was appointed to obtain Russell Barker's address & write to him concerning any contract which the University has, or had, with him for publishing "Indiana Our Indiana".

Treas. was authorized to procure a bond or have the necessary changes made in the old one, & charge the cost to the Union. Treas. reported pool room profits for past week, which will be deposited to the Union acct at the bank. Hall appointed to continue as pool room committee for remainder of the yr. Mullins appointed to take charge of the scrap book for next year.

Pres. Deitsch bro't up the matter of securing dates for the social calendar next yr. & the advisability of the Union giving open dances discussed. A Committee composed of Starr (Chairman), Stauffer, & Holdeman was appointed to investigate possibility of having assembly hall floor made ^{more} suitable for dancing.

After some discussion it was decided that the Union would not sponsor cap-burning this yr since the Union went on record last yr as being vs. sponsoring it again & since the Skull & Crescent is considering sponsoring it.
