Roll Call. Starr absent. Minutes of Sept 25, read & approved as corrected.

Forkner reports a total profit of \$83.50 on the dance of Sept. 28th. Enough to ^{be taken from the treasury to} make this amount \$100 ~~to be taken from the treasury~~ which will be given to the band fund.

Miles reports that Biddle cannot make an offer of royalties on the song "Indiana Our Indiana" until he has received bids on the cost of publishing it.

It was suggested that notice be given the men students that men were needed for the "I" section so that they could apply for permanent places in it. Hedeman appointed to get in touch with Fisher & Cleaver and make this suggestion.

Moved that the treasurer be authorized to have a sign made and to pay to boys to carry it around at the game to advertise the dance of October 6th. Motion seconded & carried. Wall appointed to secure the band of Monkhouse & Hanna provided they are satisfactory. Forkner, Stauffer & Wall appointed as floor committee.

Moved that Forkner be authorized to buy sufficient floor wax for each dance to be given hereafter. Seconded & passed. Stauffer appointed to check up on posters for advertising Union dances. Moved that he be authorized to have six posters made and posted if the old ones cannot be found. Seconded & passed.

Cogdon appointed to see that the gridgraph be set up & to find men for operating it for the Michigan game. Moved that 6 men be employed to set up and work the gridgraph at 40¢ per hour, & that Cogdon be pd. 60¢ per hour. Seconded & passed.

Harold Jones nominated and unanimously elected by the Board to fill the vacancy left by James L. Miller who did not return to the University this fall.

Muellins appointed to investigate the cost of ^{junior} stationery and report at next meeting.

Meeting adjourned 8:10 P.M.
