

Oct 16th, 1928.

Roll call. Stauffer absent. Minutes of Oct 9th read and approved.

Cragdon reports receipts of \$91⁵⁰ on the gridgraph and that there will be a profit of \$15⁰⁰ or \$20⁰⁰.

Dance of Friday 12th showed a loss of \$8⁰⁰. Moved that if Wall cannot arrange for an orchestra on a percentage basis, with the Union's share 15 or more percent, that the dance of the 19th not be held. Seconded & carried. Whether or not the Union will have a dance Nov. 2nd to be determined at a later meeting.

Forkner and Deitsch to see Highway in regard to the question as to who owns the copyright of "Indiana Our Indiana".

Miles reports that Biddle has no information as yet on the publishing of this song in sheet form.

Deitsch reports that Frank Potter wishes to buy the obsolete and broken phonograph which is in the pool room. Moved by Mullins that Frank be given the phonograph. Motion failed. Motion made that a member of the board be appointed to sell the phonograph to Potter for whatever the latter will pay. Seconded & carried. Deitsch to take care of this.

The following bills were allowed:

\$5.00 to Archie Warner for printing advertisements for Gridgraph.

\$10.00 to Ostott for balance due them on dance of Fri. 12th.

Forkner authorized to pay the men who set up and operated the gridgraph.

After some discussion it was decided that the Union will not sponsor a pep session before the Illinois game.

Deitsch reports that the Union has been asked to help the University Homecoming Committee & that he agreed on behalf of the Union that it would do so.
