Roll call. Dawson absent. Minutes of Oct 16 read & approved.
No report on dance of Nov. 19th.

Forkner reports that Fisher requests Union members going to Union dances to stop at the doors & have their names written on a ticket so that the number of tickets taken up will correspond with the number of couples present at the dance.

Deitsch reports sale of the phonograph to Potter for \$2.00. Also reports that the chairman of homecoming committee requested the help of a member of the Union Board to aid in advertising & decorating the town for homecoming. Stauffer appointed to do this.

Deitsch reports that the "I" section will be formed for the homecoming game, and that a number of ^{white} tickets admitting men to this section have been given to the medics. The remainder of the white tickets are to be distributed by Pebble at Interfraternity Council. Red tickets for those who will form the red part of the "I" section will be available at the activities office.

Holdeman appointed to distribute the red cloth & to report the plans for the "I" section to the Student. Deitsch to see Fisher in regard to the matter of guests of students not being allowed to sit in the student section with the students.

Deitsch reports that the Homecoming committee has arranged for a pep session Thursday night to be held at assembly hall. Also reports receipt of a letter from Harker stating that Mr. Barahouse, owner of the copyright of the Viking Song, claims a royalty on publications of "Indiana Our Indiana". The matter has been taken up with the Melrose Pub. Co. in an effort to have them settle the claim of Barahouse & submit a separate offer to the Union.

Moved that no dance be held Nov. 2nd due to the large number of other dances to be held on that date on the campus. Seconded & Carried.
\$4.00 bill to Checker Cab. Co. for 3 dances allowed. Forkner authorized to pay bills for advertising, stationery, etc.

It was decided to have the printing bill submitted to the Union Board each month. Each member of the board putting an ad in the Student is to make a notation of it & give such notation to Forkner. Forkner appointed to request the Student office to obtain the name of the member placing an ad in the paper, & what such ad is for so that a more accurate check may be had on the printing bill.
