

Oct 30, 1928

Roll call. Minutes of Oct 23rd read & approved.

Upon Pebbli's request, Deitsch agreed, on behalf of the Union, that the Union would aid in defraying the cost of homecoming decorations, the amount so paid not to exceed \$25⁰⁰. The Interfraternity council and the Alumni office each donated \$25⁰⁰ for this purpose. Moved that the Union secure an audited statement of the cost of such decorations and pay its proportionate share of the expense. Motion seconded & carried.

After some discussion of the question, it was moved that the Union continue its membership in the Chamber of Commerce. Motion seconded & carried.

X Deitsch reports on the situation regarding the song "Indiana Our Indiana". Barnhouse, in a letter, stated he was willing to allow the publishing to continue for one-half the amount of royalties offered the Union by Melrose Co. Moved that Deitsch assume full responsibility in disposing of the matter of the song. Seconded & carried.

Forkner reports that profits from the pool room have been averaging from ten to fifteen dollars per week.

It was suggested that the Union fee fund, which the University has charge of, & which has been drawing 2% interest, be withdrawn, if possible, and placed out at higher interest. Also suggested that it be investigated what amount the University will pay by requisition from this fund and what sort of expenditures will be allowed to be paid by such requisitions. Forkner appointed to investigate these matters & also to determine whether the Union funds in the hands of the University, if not used up at the end of the year, are turned into the general treasury of the University.
