

Nov 20th, 1928

Roll call. Minutes of Nov. 13th read + approved.

Deitsch reports that the Union owes \$2000 of its original \$2,200 memorial pledge and that there is approximately \$1700 in the Union Fee Fund. Moved that \$1500 be paid on the pledge, such amt to be withdrawn from the Union Fee Fund provided the fee fund can be drawn on for general expenditures of the Union should it become necessary. Motion seconded + carried. Deitsch also reports that trustees will do nothing definite with regard to the new Union bldg until after the next meeting of the Legislature. Provision has been made in the budget for an auditorium which will be a university project + will not be included as a part of the new Union bldg.

Bongdon reports that the cost of a private wire for the Purdue game will be \$29.00 unless the Evening World will also subscribe, in which case the cost will be \$21.50

Deitsch reports that the Union and the English Dept are promoting the Tony Sarg Marionette Show to be held here Dec. 11th. The company is to give two performances for ^{a guarantee of} \$250 plus 60% of the receipts of both performances, ^{over \$250} and the Union and English Dept will share equally the profit or loss. The Union is to help in advertising + in selling tickets. Holdeman appointed to distribute advertising cards to the various business houses in town.

Moved that the Union not purchase torches for the pep session to be fostered by the interfraternity council Thursday Nov. 22nd. Seconded + carried.

Moved that Wall secure the least expensive campus band for a dance to be held December 8th. Seconded + carried.

Deitsch reports that the Nat'l assn of all college Unions is to meet at Nashville, Tenn., on Dec. 6th, 7th + 8th. Moved that the Union send Pres. Deitsch to this association meeting as its representative, + advance expense money for such purpose to him. Motion seconded + carried.
