1. Minutes of preceding meeting read, corrected, and approved.
2. Treasurer made his report:
 - (a) Dance, Sept. 13, 1930, made profit of \$138⁵⁰ from a ~~xxx~~ sale of 235 tickets at \$1⁰⁰ each.
 - (b) Cash in bank, \$239⁰⁰.
 - (c) Check for \$4¹⁵ from Melrose Pub. Co. as royalties for use of "Indiana" song.
 - (d) Pool Room receipts for summer session
3. Following a printed suggestion issued from the office of Dean of Women, A.W.S. and the Union have, according to the Union President, come to an agreement ~~now~~ regarding to taking the responsibility of printing the social calendar: beginning this year with the Union, the two organizations are to alternate annually in assuming this burden, so that responsibility for a successful printing of the social calendar will be lodged every other year with the Union. Over-passing, want of co-ordination, and juggling of liability are thus avoided hereafter; and a social calendar worthy of the institution is assured.
4. A bill of \$8⁶⁰ from the Press for 100 social calendars was ordered paid.
5. The mailing of cards ~~weekly~~ by the secretary to each Board Member, advising him of the next meeting, was discussed; after deliberating duly, the board carried through a motion to continue the present practice of not mailing cards.
6. A committee composed of Brown, Sharpe, & Fowler, was appointed to confer with Coach ~~H. C. (Pat) Page~~ ^{Patt} as to the selection of yell leaders for football games. The committee was empowered to take the necessary steps toward selecting yell leads if ~~Patt~~ failed to cooperate.
7. Stationery for the Union Board will be ordered in the following amounts: 1000 pulpers, 1000 sheets, 100 stamped envelopes.

8. Jones appointed to communicate with the La Fayette picture-framer as to details of framing the 3 ~~improved~~ ~~pictures~~ ~~of the town~~ the 3 paintings remaining unframed of the 10 owned by the ~~Board~~ Union.
