Roll Call -- Prof Robinson, Judge Batman, George Heighway were absent.

Minutes were read and approved.

Patrick gave a report of the post prom dance, in the amount of money taken in at the desk. It was stated that this along with the remaining amount to be collected from ticket sales would result in only about a \$10 loss for the dance.

Mr. Biddle gave a monthly report of the operation of the building and explained that it was necessary to operate the check room for banquets and for other special meetings that are held in the building. Since the cafeteria contributes nothing to defray the labor for operation of this room it is necessary for the Union to pay the same. These expenses are taken out of receipts from dances held from time to time.

Moved, seconded that ten (10) cigarette stands be bought for the Union Board room. Carried.

Fletchall announced that the Dramaxtic board of control has returned \$50 that was given to them by the Union to be used in the carrying out of the cabaret dance that was held in April. They extended their thanks to the board for the offering of the use of same.

Fletchall explained the dance situation to such at the present time that it would be undesirable to continue with the regular dances for the remainder of the semester.

Moved, seconded that the Union have no more dances for the remainder of the semester. Carried.

Mr. Biddle announced that bids have been submitted for the construction of check room equipment which would be ready for use next fall.

Meeting adjourned at 7:35.
