Fletchall read a letter from the "Arbutus" concerning whether Union Board still desired to have their usual space in the yearbook for this year. Moved and seconded that same space as was used last year be devoted to the Board this coming year. Carried. That the price for these two pages would be \$40. The president appointed Ralston to inform the business manager of the Arbutus and also appointed Keisler to see that the explaination as given of the purposes of the Board in the yearbook, be changed to explain more fully the purposes of the Board.

Biddle gave the weekly financial report and presented the bills for the week. Moved and seconded that same be accepted as read. Carried.

The president instructed the sec. to write to the 43 girls who helped in the Music Series drive, thanking them for their cooperation in same.

It was brought to the attention of the Board that there was some need for recreation among the class of students who did not feel that they were able to attend the dances as the Union A.W.S. had on Friday nights. Byron and Fineberg were appointed to meet with a committee from the Dean of Women's office and work out some plan for such.
