Roll Call: Wallace, Biddle, McNeill, Hornbostel, Prof Robinson, Judge Batman, and George Heighway were absent.

Minutes were read and approved.

The president reported a meeting with Dr. Bryan in which he assured the Board that if any change would be made in the Men's Grill that same would only be done under the control and authority of the Union Board. Also that he was not in favor of the present policy of having a candy counter in the co-operati dining rooms and would order same removed.

Fineberg reported a loss of \$24.05 on the operation of the grid graph for the last out of town football game of the year.

Dance report was given in which a net profit of 21.90 was made on the dance played by Hal Denman's band.

It was the opinion of the Board that there were several dance bands on the campus that were just getting started and that two or three of same be invited to cooperate with the Board in giving a free dance on Dec 15. Admittance to this dance to be had by wearing a I.U. button that were given to each member of the men's union.

Weekly bills and financial report was given. Moved and seconded that same be accepted as read. Carried. President appointed Ralston to investigate why the profits from candy sales have not been more than they have.

Moved and seconded that the president and Mr. Biddle be the delegates from Indiana Union to the National Union's convention carried. Mr. Byron was named as alternate.

The president re-opened the floor for nominations to fill the vacancy left by James Wallace. Rolland Clyde Huestis having been proposed at the last meeting. Hank Pond and Dave Weiner were nominated, and Huestis was elected.

Moved and seconded that the Board be given comps for the Pow*wow carried.

The fact that the Campus Council had been abolished and that Dean Wells was anxious to find some supreme governing body to take place of same was brough to the attention of the Board. It was the plan of Dean Wells to have various groups made suggestions as to whom such a board should consist of and give them to her. The president appointed Biddinger, and Hornbostel to draw up such a plan and present same to the board.
