Roll call: Fineberg, Macy, Veller, Robinson, Heighway, and Feltus were absent.

Minutes were read and approved.

Receipts Nos. 2204-2235 were read and Bills Nos. 438-442 were read. Porter moved that bills be accepted as read, Cook seconded. Carried.

Dir. Biddle reported his request to President Bryan for a sum of money to complete the furnishing of the Union Building. This plan called for everything except the furnishings for the eighth floor. He stated that his request was to be submitted to the Board of Trustees at their spring meeting.

Dir. Biddle reported that he had submitted a tentative budget to President Bryan at Bryan's request. He also read the financial statement for the 10 month period.

Dir. Biddle reported that the Knights Templar Convention held in the Union building May 4 and 5 was a huge success.

Hornbostel stressed the importance of the board members looking for new fields of union activity. Some suggestions were: a newly designed Union button to be worn on the lapel, a booklet stating facts about the Union and its activities to be passed out during registration next fall, an all men's production sponsored by the Union, and some Union activities during orientation week next fall.
