

March 19, 1936

Roll Call: Heighway and Feltus were absent.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Fineburg moved that the Board resolve itself into a committee of a whole to consider qualifications to the list of qualified union workers to be sent to the selection committee. Seconded and carried.

Wilbur Pell appearing before the Board presented his application for reinstatement upon the qualified list. He had completed only four hours of work but claimed no chance to increase this total. Herbert Quiesser appearing before the Board stated that he has a scholastic average of 1.27, but petitioned that his name also be placed upon the qualified list.

Robinson moved that all men who had at least four hours of Union work be placed on the qualified list provided that they fulfilled the other two requirements Art. 5, Sec. 3, Subsec. c. Seconded. Lost.

Huffman moved that Quiesser be placed on the qualified list only if the registrar changes his grades to meet the scholastic requirement of 1.3 and that he had fulfilled the other two requirements Art. 5, Sec. 3, sub. sec. c. Seconded and carried.

The Board elected Fox, Briggs, and Huffman to retain their chairs on the Board for the ensuing year per Art. 5, Sec. 2. Fox, Briggs, Huffman, Hanna, and Smithburn were the five men eligible to re-election. Hanna resigned on the 13th ballot yielding his place to Briggs. Hanna moved that the secretary be instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for Briggs. Seconded and carried.

Keck announced that Charles Peterson would give a billiard demonstration in the Union billiard room Thursday, March 26th at 3 and 7:30pm.

Briggs announced that the amateur hour had been indefinitely postponed due to conflicting dates. He announced 400 in attendance at the last open forum.

Biddle announced that the last Union-AWS. dance netted \$1.20 in profit.

Meeting adjourned 9:14 pm.
