RESOLUTION OF THE INDIANA UNION BOARD IN TRIBUTE

TO JUDGE WALTER E. TREANOR

Whereas, Walter E. Trianor was one of the first student members of the Indiana Union, and from 1925 to 1931 one of the faculty members of the Indiana Union Board; and

Whereas, the Indiana Union has received his able and wholehearted support constantly throughout its existence; and

Whereas, he has been a living demonstration of the principle of loyalty to Indiana University and of the democratic ideals upon which the Union is founded; and

Whereas, his career as a student and teacher, and later as a judge of the highest court of Indiana and of the second highest court of the United States, has reflected the highest honor and distinction upon the University and upon the Union; now, therefore,

Be it Resolved, that^{we,} the members of the Board of Directors of the Indiana Union of Indiana University, both on our own behalf and also on behalf of the rest of the men of Indiana University, who are the members of the Indiana Union, express our deepest

regret because of the severe loss which has thus been suffered by the Union, by the University and by each of us personally; and that we extend our deepest sympathy to the beloved widow and daughter of Walter E. Treanor; and

Be it Further Resolved that we here pay our tribute to the transparent honesty and fairness of Judge Treanor; that we express our gratitude for his example as a man of good will and of calm faith, in a world aflame with wrongs and hates and oppressions, a man who never did an injury to any fellow human-being in order to advance his own interests, but one who was always ready to give a sympathetic hearing to the victim of hardship or of injustice, and to give freely and abundantly of his own time and energy to see justice done to even the humblest of those who sought his aid; that we express our admiration of the unaffected simplicity of his character, of his wide and deep perspective, of his sound common sense, of his ready humor, of his unfailing of his refusal to use any public or private trust for his own gain, courage and independence of mind, /and of his readiness to sacrifice himself for his friends; and

Be it Further Resolved that a copy of this resolution be recorded in the permanent records of the Indiana Union, and that the Secretary be instructed to send a copy to the family, and a copy to the President and the Board of Trustees of Indiana University.
