Mr. Patrick reported that expenses for the Senior dinner were \$251.75.


Tentative plans for next year's board positions, for the etiquette booklet, and for the campus guide were discussed.

Since the next meeting is to be a two hour meeting with a financial report and building plans to be discussed, Batton suggested that the board have a cafeteria supper before the meeting.


Batton moved, Moeller seconded, for adjournment at 7:40.
