

Jan. 8, 1942

Roll call: Case and Moeller absent
Minutes read and approved.

Bill Wayne, Ralph Prickett, Paul Visher, Miss Olmstead, Miss Weiland, and Miss Lindsay were special guests for the report of the convention.

Bridges reported that there were 90 boys with 25 hours or more during December.

Visher reported that Col. Drysdale will speak at the Forum on Jan. 9 on the "Selectee and his Future."

Ricke reported that the basketball game with Minnesota Saturday night will be broadcast in the Commons.

Mr. Patrick reported that Paul Wagner, advisor of Sigma Delta Chi, had suggested joint sponsorship of his organization and Union Board in giving an all-university circus. Lucas moved and Bartley seconded that the board investigate the possibilities. Motion carried and the following committee was appointed: Krueger, chairman; Anderson; and Ricke.

Former Union Board member Russ Church has been reported killed in fighting at Manila. It was suggested that the Board might raise a plaque in the lobby for all university students who lose their lives in this war. The plaque could be temporary for the duration and be cast in bronze at the end.

Bartley moved and Bridges seconded for the appointment of a committee to see President Wells about the suggestion. Motion carried, and Bartley, Visher, and Gates were appointed on the committee.

Letters from the Michigan and Illinois unions were read explaining their adaptation of social programs to the war conditions.

President Gates read the accompanying report of the national convention.

Eason moved and Ricke seconded for adjournment after discussion about informal advisory that might be done by the board.
