Minutes read and approved.

Krueger reported that letters had been received from Mr. Biddle about the suggested walk from sixth street to the Union building; from the student war council thanking the Union for its expression of cooperation; and from the Michigan State union in regard to their program carried out during their extra semester.

Moeller moved and Bridges seconded that the secretary write a letter to the Student Affairs Committee asking for permission to hold dancing in the Commons on Wednesday night. Motion carried.

Lucas reported that the dance committee has set the dates for the four dances remaining on the Union-AWS schedule; March 13 and 20; April 10 and 24.

The bridge tournament will be run off on March 6 and 13, with a practice session on Friday, Feb. 20. There will be an entrance fee of 25¢ per person for supplies and prizes.

Bridges reported that the billiard team took second in the recent tournament.

It was suggested that it might be possible to start a book review club. The Woodburn room of the bookstore is available, and members of the club could buy books at a reduced rate.

Moeller reported that there will be a rebroadcast of the Iowa game at 7:30 in the Commons Monday, Feb. 23.

Unless it is possible to get insurance for the hobby show, the risk involved will probably force cancellation.

President Gates read a letter from the National Student Service of the United States inviting the sending of a delegate to a conference in Washington on March 5-8.

The balance on January 31, 1942, in the dance fund was \$197.54.

The complete social program for the rest of the semester was read, and special projects which the union might emphasize were discussed.
