Roll Call: All present.
Minutes read and approved.

Anderson reported that the tickets for the winter sports banquet will be ready for distribution Wednesday. The publicity is also ready.

It was suggested that the winter sports banquet might be given in conjunction with the senior farewell banquet. Visher had received a letter from Dr. Elliot saying that the new freshman handbook is a much needed aid to the freshmen.

Lucas reported that there were six tables of bridge at the practice session Friday night. A good time was had by all, he emphasized. The first regular session will probably have to be changed to Wed. or Thurs. night if Saturday, March 7, is a free Saturday. The second session on March 13 conflicts with a Union-AWS dance and the opening of the Jordan Ricer Revue. The dance committee will change the dates if necessary.

Krueger reported that the proposed carnival to be given with Sigma Delta Chi could properly be postponed until next year if plans are completed now with the idea of making it an annual affair.

Case moved and Bartley seconded for adjournment at 7:35.
