Lucas announced that plans were pending for the establishment of a Navy yeoman's training school on the campus. After a discussion of the training school, which will ultimately place 1,200 trainees on the campus, MacGill moved to accept these men into the Union on the same status as University students if the school is established. Bridges seconded. Carried.

Lucas announced a meeting of the Summer Board on Tuesday, May 12.

The personnel committee heads were asked to check on the number of summer workers. Cox and Baernkopf were appointed to supervise getting "Our Indiana" booklets to freshman registrants for the third semester.

Bridges was appointed chairman of the Summer Board.

Anderson moved and Ricke seconded for adjournment at 8:00.
