Baerncopf reported that 83 persons were served at the freshman mixer and he would present an expense account at the next meeting. About 25 applications were received from summer workers.

McKown announced that women were still using the billiard rooms, even at un-authorized times. This action was not criticized.

Blickman reported that music by accordion and nickelodeon and speeches by Mr. Robert Shaffer and Prof. E.J. Hedges, Blickman, Wolf and Baerncopf aided the success of the mixer. Other guests were Dr. Beck and Dean Wright. He recommended that a similar party be given in the fall instead of the Freshman Welsome banquet. Bridges directed him to make a written report.

Cox announced that light crowds at convocations had made little usher service necessary. He said that there probably would be no Open Forums this summer.

MacGill reported that Chuck Raymond's orchestra would play for Union-A.W.S. dances until furthur notice. There was a discussion of possible financial arrangements for the summer prom.

Mr. Patrick read a note from Robert Miller, reviewing the conversation concerning the reading shelf. Mr. Patrick said that he would contact Mr. Miller about financial arrangements if the Board accepts the reading service. He also read comments from other Unions on "Our Indiana."

Baerncopf moved to adjourn. Cox seconded. Meeting adjourned at 5:20 p.m.
