Dean Mueller was notified by letter that the Union would continue its regular summer program. All other organization on campus planning patriotic programs must get the consent of the War council, it was announced.

Usher Service: Cox reported a small attendance at Wednesday night's convocation.

McKown moved for adjournment. Cox seconded. Meeting adjourned at 4:45 p.m.
