Meeting called to order by Wolf.
Roll call: All present.
Minutes read and approved.

McCarty reported that George Olsen had been contracted to play for the formal dance, November 6.

Rich reported that the present Union-AWS Social Committee ruling in regard to Union-AWS functions provides that any social organization wishing to hold a dance on campus must obtain the approval of the Committee. Radigan moved to change the Board's previous recommendation to provide that any social organization wishing to hold a dance on campus on Friday or Saturday night must obtain the approval of the Committee. Wiggins 2nd. Carried.

Radigan reported on homecoming plans in regard to beauty queens, pep rally, bonfire, and auditorium program.

Wolf reported that the army swing band, army chorus, and navy glee club would participate in the auditorium program.

Howard reported that little response was received from the fraternity presidents to whom he mailed letters about Union service workers.

Radigan reported that the gridgraph will be set up at 9:00 on Saturday, October 9, and requested that it be operated by Union service workers.

Turner instructed to get the Hell to work on the campus calendars with service workers supplied by Howard.

Howard moved that Blue Key points be given Union service workers and that their work be considered in the selection of future board members. MCarty 2nd. Carried.

Radigan moved that Tom Gallmeyer, former board member now stationed on the campus, be asked to attend meetings in an advisory capacity. Wiggins 2nd. Carried.

Wolf presented plans for entertainment of service people. McCarty moved that starting October 10 movies should be shown free to service people each Sunday in Alumni Hall; that the ASTP swing band play at Union-AWS dances and for special occasions, and that service people be allowed to borrow books from the Union Fireside Bookshop free.

Howard introduced a resolution that a letter of explanation about free movies be sent to theater managers; that the program be explained in the Daily Student, giving reasons for the distinction made between civilian and military students. Carried.

Wiggins reported on billiards, chess, and records. Howard moved that Mr. Wahl be placed in charge of the billiard tournament. Radigan 2nd. Carried.

Turner moved that the Board handle publicity, supply referees, and provide the prizes to be given the winners.

The Board instructed Rich and Wiggins to confer with the record

committee.

Howard reported that a Town Hall committee would be formed to draw up plans for meetings.

Rich reported that no action has be taken in regard to the suspension of Saturday classes during homecoming.

Turner moved that the meeting be adjourned. Howard 2nd. Adjourned.
